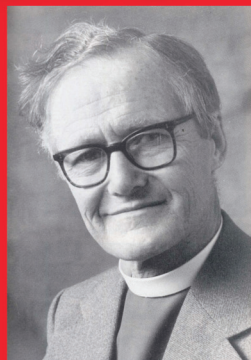


Newbiggin

Bishop James Edward Lesslie Newbiggin was born on 8th December 1909 and died on 30th January 1998. He was an outstanding figure in the twentieth-century ecumenical movement. As a Church of Scotland missionary, evangelist and preacher, mission strategist, social visionary and person of prayer he played pioneering roles in the united Church of South India and in the World Council of Churches. After forty years in India his last twenty-five years were devoted to addressing the spiritual malaise of the secularised West.
